MINI-CHECK – CAN I DO THIS YET?

- ☐ I check the verb of the statement first: if it is be, I move am, is, or are directly before the subject.
- ☐ With other verbs I place do or does before the subject: "Do you ...?" and "Does she ...?"
- ☐ After "does" I use the base form of the main verb — the -s moves forward and never appears twice.
- ☐ My short answers echo the helper from the question: "Yes, I do." or "No, she doesn't."

Not every box ticked? Build the lesson once more and try this sheet again tomorrow.

Check only when you have finished. Every answer comes with the **why** — the rule matters more than the result.

<i>Ordinary main verbs need "does" before the subject — the -s moves to the helper.</i></p> <p>02 Does she like her new job?
<i>After "does" the main verb stays in the base form — the -s already sits in "does".</i></p> <p>03 Are you the new assistant?
<i>If the verb is be, it moves forward itself — do not add "do".</i></p> | <p>04 Does she work in your department?
<i>"Is" + main verb mixes two patterns; "work" needs "does".</i></p> <p>05 "Do you have a minute?" — "Yes, I do."
<i>The short answer echoes the helper from the question, not the main verb.</i></p> <p>06 Do your colleagues join the call?
<i>"Colleagues" is plural (= they) — the helper is "do".</i></p> |

Your sentences may differ — just check that the word before the subject is correct: a form of be, or do/does.

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| <p>01 "Are you the new marketing manager?"
<i>A be-question: "are" moves directly before "you".</i></p> <p>02 "Do you like the new office?"
<i>"Like" is a main verb; with "you", "do" goes first.</i></p> | <p>03 "Does she take the early train to work?"
<i>With "she" the helper is "does"; "take" stays in the base form.</i></p> <p>04 "No, I don't."
<i>The short answer echoes the helper "do" from the question.</i></p> |
