Each line belongs in exactly one column. A **profile line** says what you are professionally, with no verb at the front; an **achievement bullet** starts with a verb and names one thing you did.

Trained twelve colleagues on the new ticket system.

IT support specialist with a background in first- and second-line support.

Built a monthly reporting pack for four cost centres.

Accountant with eight years in accounts payable and a focus on month-end closing.

Negotiated new payment terms with two logistics providers.

Purchasing manager with a track record in supplier negotiations across three countries.

Filled fourteen technical vacancies in a single year.

MINI-CHECK — CAN I DO THIS YET?

- ☐ Jobs and qualifications start with the most recent entry.
- ☐ Every bullet opens with a verb and no "I": past simple for what is finished, present simple for ongoing duties — and one of them carries a number.
- ☐ I write internship, apprenticeship, skills, manager, current and "2019–present" instead of the German words.
- ☐ For the UK and the US I leave out the photo, date of birth and marital status; German, Austrian and Swiss employers often still expect them.

Check only when you have finished. Every answer comes with the **why** — the rule matters more than the result.

BRICK 1 · SORTING

01 **profile line** HR officer with five years of experience in technical recruitment.

Job title plus years, with no verb at the front.

02 **achievement bullet** Trained twelve colleagues on the new ticket system.

"Trained" comes first and names a finished piece of work.

03 **profile line** IT support specialist with a background in first- and second-line support.

The line describes the role, not an action.

04 **achievement bullet** Built a monthly reporting pack for four cost centres.

Verb first, with a number in it.

05 **profile line** Accountant with eight years in accounts payable and a focus on month-end closing.

Who you are professionally — with no finite verb.

06 **achievement bullet** Negotiated new payment terms with two logistics providers.

"Negotiated" opens the bullet in the past simple.

07 **profile line** Purchasing manager with a track record in supplier negotiations across three countries.

Role plus focus, as in the profile at the top.

08 **achievement bullet** Filled fourteen technical vacancies in a single year.

One completed result, with a number.

BRICK 2 · FILL-IN

01 **Introduced** a new invoice check.

The job is over — past simple, verb first.

02 **Manage** the supplier database for two sites.

An ongoing duty in the current role: present simple.

03 Completed a three-month **internship** in the accounts department.

"Praktikum" is an internship, not a "practice".

04 Start the CV with your name and your job **title**.

"Berufsbezeichnung" is the job title on a CV.

05 Your Kenntnisse belong under the heading **Skills**.

"Kenntnisse" are skills; "knowledges" is not used this way.

06 Reported weekly to the line **manager** of the accounts team.

"Chef" is the manager or line manager — a chef cooks.

07 In my **current** role I look after two accounting systems.

"Aktuell" is current; "actual" means real.

08 The date line reads 2019–**present**.

For "seit 2019" the date line takes "2019–present".

BRICK 3 · CORRECT

01 Completed a six-week **internship** in the purchasing department.

A Praktikum in a company is an internship.

02 **Apprenticeship** as a bank clerk, 2013–2016.

The dual-training route is an apprenticeship; vocational training works as the broader label.

03 My **current** role is team leader in first-line support.

"Aktuell" is current — "actual" means real.

04 Payroll Officer, Hannover, **2019–present**.

A job that is still running goes in the date line as "2019–present".

05 **Skills:** SAP, DATEV, Excel.

The heading for Kenntnisse is Skills.

06 Managed a team of five and **reduced** invoice errors by 15%.

Both achievements are finished, so both verbs stand in the past simple.

BRICK 4 · WRITE

Your lines may differ — just check the verb at the front, the tense and the number.

01 **Accounts payable specialist with six years of experience in a manufacturing company.**

The profile line gets by without "I" and often without a finite verb.

02 **Coordinated the move of four teams to a new payroll system in 2022.**

A completed achievement: past simple, verb first, with a number.

03 **Manage the holiday planning for a team of twelve.**

An ongoing duty in the current role: present simple.

04 **Apprenticeship as an office management assistant, 2012–2015.**

The English term plus the years — the most recent entry on top.
