# Answer key

Check only when you have finished. Every answer comes with the **why** — the rule matters more than the result.

## BRICK 1 · SORTING

01 I'm going to ask for a day off → **Plan**  
*An intention that was fixed before speaking.*

02 Look at his calendar — he's going to miss the train →

**Vorhersage**

*The packed calendar is visible now — clear evidence.*

03 They're going to open a Berlin branch → **Plan**  
*A company decision that has already been made.*

04 The printer is flashing — it's going to stop any minute →

**Vorhersage**

*The flashing is the present evidence.*

05 We're going to buy new laptops → **Plan**  
*The team's intention, decided beforehand.*

06 Listen to that noise — the lift is going to break →  
**Vorhersage**

*The noise is audible now — the prediction rests on it.*

07 She's going to talk to her boss tomorrow → **Plan**  
*Her intention exists before the conversation.*

08 The figures look bad — we're going to lose the client →  
**Vorhersage**

*The current figures are the visible evidence.*

09 He's going to hand in his notice → **Plan**  
*A personal decision that is already settled.*

10 It's nearly five — the meeting is going to overrun →  
**Vorhersage**

*The time shows now where this is heading.*

## BRICK 2 · FILL-IN

01 I **am** going to send the report tonight.  
*"I" takes "am".*

02 she **is** going to fall asleep in the meeting  
*"She" takes "is" — the tiredness is visible now.*

03 We **are** going to move to a bigger office  
*"We" takes "are" — a settled plan.*

04 he **isn't** going to take the job  
*A decided refusal — "not" goes right after "is".*

05 **Are** you going to join the workshop on Friday?  
*In a question, "are" moves before the subject "you".*

06 They **aren't** going to finish by Friday  
*"They" takes "are"; the situation shows it won't be enough.*

07 you **are** going to spill your coffee  
*"You" takes "are" — the cup is already tipping.*

08 I **am** not going to work this Saturday  
*"I" takes "am"; "not" follows right after.*

## BRICK 3 · CORRECT

01 I'm going to call the client tomorrow.  
*Going to needs a form of "be" before it — with "I": "am".*

02 She **is** going to lead the workshop.  
*"She" takes "is"; not "are".*

03 He's going to **fly** to London on Monday.  
*The base verb follows going to — with no ending.*

04 I'm **going to** send the email this afternoon.  
*"Gonna" is spoken only — in writing it is "going to".*

05 **Are you** going to attend the training?  
*In a question, the form of "be" moves before the subject.*

06 He **isn't going** to join us for the call.  
*You negate "be" — not with "doesn't".*

## BRICK 4 · WRITE

Your sentences may differ — just check: subject + matching am/is/are + going to + base verb.

01 "I'm **going to cook** dinner after work."  
*A plan decided before; "I" + "am" + base verb.*

02 "This weekend, I'm **going to visit** my parents."  
*A weekend intention — going to + base verb "visit".*

03 "We're **going to present** the new design next month."  
*"We" takes "are"; then the base verb "present".*

04 "Look at my inbox — it's **going to take** all morning."  
*Visible evidence; "it" takes "is".*
