<i>After the preposition "with" comes the object form him.</i></p> <p>05 I called them about the missing invoice.
<i>After the verb "called" you need the object form — "they" only appears before the verb.</i></p> <p>06 Maria and I prepared the slides for the meeting.
<i>Before the verb you need the subject form — "me" cannot be a subject.</i></p> |
