- ☐ I learn each pair as one unit and note it down with a pronoun straight away.
- ☐ With a separable pair, a noun object may stand on either side of the particle.
- ☐ With a separable pair I put a pronoun in the middle: "fill it in", never "fill in it".
- ☐ I never split an inseparable pair like "go over" or "deal with"; with "get back to" the object follows both particles.
