MINI-CHECK — CAN I DO THIS YET?

- ☐ I build the form from two parts: am/is/are + verb-ing — "She's talking."
- ☐ I recognise the three uses: right now ("right now"), temporary ("this week"), and arranged plan ("on Friday").
- ☐ I spell the -ing form correctly: make → making, sit → sitting.
- ☐ With stative verbs like "know" and "need" I use the present simple: "I need the file."

<i>"Every Friday" = habit — present simple, not continuous.</i></p> |
