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02 Last week: "Did you ...?" — a yes/no question about the past week.

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03 Polite at the office: "Could you tell me ...?" — an indirect question for a client.

04 Quick check: "Are you ...?" — a question with be for your next call.

MINI-CHECK — CAN I DO THIS YET?

- ☐ I put do, does, or did before the subject — the main verb stays in the base form.
- ☐ With he, she, it the -s jumps onto the helper: "Does he drive?" — not "does he drives".
- ☐ I build wh-questions with QASV: question word, auxiliary, subject, verb — in that order.
- ☐ Be and modal verbs invert without do, and after "Could you tell me ...?" the statement order stays.

Not every box ticked? Build the lesson once more and try this sheet again tomorrow.



Answer key

Check only when you have finished. Every answer comes with the **why** — the rule matters more than the result.

<i>Full verb, subject your team (it) → does; the verb stays in the base form.</i></p> <p>02 Are you free on Tuesday?
<i>"Free" is an adjective — the verb is be, and be inverts on its own.</i></p> <p>03 Did the client call yesterday?
<i>"Yesterday" = finished past → did for every person.</i></p> <p>04 Can we start the meeting?
<i>The modal can inverts without do — just swap subject and can.</i></p> <p>05 Do you need the slides before noon?
<i>Full verb, subject you, present → do.</i></p> | <p>06 Could you tell me where the printer is?
<i>Indirect question: statement order after the opener, no do inside.</i></p> <p>07 What does this abbreviation mean?
<i>Wh-question with QASV; subject this abbreviation (it) → does.</i></p> <p>08 Is the report ready yet?
<i>"Ready" is an adjective — be inverts on its own, no do.</i></p> <p>09 Why did they cancel the order?
<i>Past → did; then the base form cancel.</i></p> <p>10 Who wrote this email?
<i>"Who" asks about the doer (subject) here — no helper needed.</i></p> |

<i>Plural subject colleagues, present habit → do.</i></p> <p>02 Did you get my email yesterday morning?
<i>"Yesterday morning" is finished past → did.</i></p> <p>03 Do we need to book the room in advance?
<i>Subject we, general present question → do.</i></p> <p>04 Does the flight usually leave on time?
<i>Subject the flight (it) → does; "usually" marks the habit.</i></p> | <p>05 Were you at the conference last week?
<i>No full verb in the sentence → be inverts itself; past with you → were.</i></p> <p>06 Did they receive the invoice two weeks ago?
<i>"Ago" = a finished point in time → did.</i></p> <p>07 How was the training session yesterday?
<i>Be inverts itself; the session (it) in the past → was.</i></p> <p>08 Why does the workshop always begin so early?
<i>QASV; the workshop (it), a habit → does, base form begin.</i></p> |

<i>The helper is missing — a wh-question needs QASV with do.</i></p> <p>02 Does he live near the office?
<i>Only be and modal verbs invert — the full verb live needs does.</i></p> <p>03 Does the price include the software licence?
<i>After does the verb takes the base form — the -s already sits in the helper.</i></p> | <p>04 Are you happy with the new supplier?
<i>Never mix be with do — be inverts on its own.</i></p> <p>05 Do you know where the meeting room is?
<i>Indirect question: statement order inside, subject before verb.</i></p> <p>06 Did you send the agenda?
<i>After did comes the base form — the past lives in did.</i></p> |

<i>Statement order after the opener — no do inside.</i></p> <p>04 "Are you happy with the new schedule?"
<i>"Happy" is an adjective → be inverts without do.</i></p> |
