<i>A duration up to today → present perfect + for; the English present tense cannot span then to now.</i></p> <p>03 I studied engineering from 2012 to 2016.
<i>"From 2012 to 2016" is dated and over → past simple; finished time bans the present perfect.</i></p> | <p>04 So far, I have led more than thirty client workshops.
<i>"So far" draws an open total up to today → present perfect.</i></p> <p>05 Currently, I work as a logistics coordinator in Duisburg.
<i>Age and family do not belong in the answer — open with the role instead.</i></p> <p>06 Now I'm looking to take over bigger projects.
<i>"Looking to" takes the base verb, not an -ing form.</i></p> |
