<i>You point at the snow outside → right now.</i></p> <p>05 It's raining now — I can hear it.
<i>You hear the rain at this moment → the -ing form.</i></p> | <p>06 It rains most days in April.
<i>"Most days" says what usually happens → a habit.</i></p> <p>07 It's snowing right now in Munich.

<i>How your body feels: I'm cold — "Me is" is ungrammatical.</i></p> <p>03 The app says it's only 8 degrees this morning.
<i>After 8, degrees takes the plural -s.</i></p> | <p>04 What's the weather like in Vienna today? / How's the weather in Vienna today?
<i>What's ... like? or How's ...? without like — don't mix them.</i></p> <p>05 Look, it's raining! Where is my umbrella?
<i>Rain right now: it's raining — the "s" is missing.</i></p> <p>06 Close the door, please — it's very windy today.
<i>Weather: it's + adjective — wind → windy.</i></p> |
