<i>"Holiday" is singular for one trip — "holidays" means longer free periods, like school breaks.</i></p> | <p>04 We were at a conference last month.
<i>The past simple of "be" for a plural subject is "were", not "was".</i></p> <p>05 He is going to fly to Chicago next week.
<i>"going to" needs a form of "be" — "is" was missing.</i></p> <p>06 I saw my old colleague at the airport last week.
<i>The past simple of "see" is "saw", not "seen" (that is the participle).</i></p> |
