- ☐ I form the will future with will + base verb — the same for every person.
- ☐ I make negatives with won't and questions by inversion: "Will you ...?"
- ☐ I use will for instant decisions, offers, promises, and opinion predictions.
- ☐ I spot the German traps: "I will help" does not mean "ich will helfen," and fixed timetables take the present simple.
